# Regulations governing Deeds Toll of Change of Name.

The safeguards instituted to ensure that an alien enemy should not change his or her name by Deed Toll are as follows:

- (1) If naturalized, naturalization certificate must be produced.
- (2) In other cases a certificate must be inscribed on the Deed Toll by a Solicitor in one of two forms.
  - (a) That he knows of his own knowledge that the person executing the Deed is a British Subject, or.
  - (b) That he has made all enquiries and is satisfied that the person executing the Deed is a British Subject.
- (3) Where a Solicitor cannot give either of the Certificates above mentioned an Affidavit or Declaration by an undoubted British Subject and a householder, (wherein he exhibits the Deed Toll and the Birth Certificate of the person executing the Deed Toll and swears <sup>and</sup>/<sub>or</sub> declares they are one and the same person) is insisted upon.

The name of the Solicitor or Agent must be endorsed on the Deed and the number of folios.
